Our Progress

Accessible

Our Middle Years students developed their technology skills with experts throughout the school year, including a visit to the Royal Aviation Museum.

Our Student Services Team also designed and created a Movement Path to be installed in our hallways, with support from Divisional OT.



A dedicated team of teachers continued to develop our House Teams program for all students, who will remain in these teams throughout future school years, while they are engaged in whole-school team-building activities.

Our students also furthered their connections with our surrounding community with events throughout the school year, including our annual MPI Bike Rodeo, which included a bike ride to practice newly learned skills within our community.
